
The kingdom of heaven is like a king who prepared a wedding banquet for his son...

Parable Reminders

- A Parable is <u>not</u> a straightforward description of an event, just as it occurred or will occur.
- A Parable is a <u>casting or placing side by side</u> to a real event or <u>to compare likeness or</u> <u>similitude</u> to reveal the true meaning by interpretation.


Context: Parable of the Wedding Feast

- Matthew 21:28-32
 - Parable of the Two Sons
 - Appearances can be deceiving, as religious leaders were offended by Jesus Christ reaching out to outcasts of society.
 - A warning to us is not be a child of God, who promises to work, then neglects to keep his word. We must live God's will daily and depend upon His strength.



Context: Parable of the Wedding Feast

- Matthew 21:33-46 (Mark 12:1-11; Luke 20:9-18)
 - The parable appears to point to God's desire to see spiritual fruit from His people.
 - Psalm 80:8-15 / Isaiah 5:1-7 gives us insight to the vineyard, as a close parallel parable.
 - Possible implications for the church; If the church fails to produce fruit, it cannot presume on its privileged position



- Matthew 22:1-14
 - Parable of the Wedding Feast
 - God's calling seems to correspond with the King's invitation.
 The invitation went out to the original guest list (House of Israel and House of Judah), to the Church and will go to all mankind.
 - While God's calling is widespread going out to many, those who choose to respond to the invitation and choose to wear the proper wedding garment could be a smaller group.



- Matthew 22:14
 - "Called" Kletos / Invited / G2822
 - Romans 8:28 "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose."
 - I Corinthians 1:2; 24 "Unto the church of God which is at Corinth, to them that are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, with all that in every place call upon the name of Jesus Christ our Lord, both theirs and ours...But unto them which are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God."

- Matthew 22:14
 - "Chosen" Eklektos / Chosen or Elect/ G1586
 - Matthew 24:14; 24 "And except those days should be shortened, there should no flesh be saved, but for the elect's sake those days shall be shortened...For there shall arise fales Christs and false prophets, and shall show great signs and wonders, insomuch that if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect."
 - I Peter 2:9 "But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people, that you should show forth praises of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light."

CHOSEN BY

- Matthew 22:14
 - "Chosen" Eklektos / Chosen or Elect/ G1586
 - Hosea 11:1 (Matthew 2:15) "When Israel was a child, I loved him, and I called my son out of Egypt."
 - Romans 8:30 "Moreover whom He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified.
 - If you are a Christian, you have been called;
 called to respond to God and to become His possession.



Matthew 22:14

- "Chosen" Eklektos / Chosen or Elect/ G1586
 - Although we may have responded to the call of Salvation, we may turn away from that call, even after having first responded to it.
 - <u>Deuteronomy 7:6</u> "The Lord your God has chosen you to be a people for His own possession out of all the peoples who are on the face of the earth..."
 - They first said 'yes' to the invitation. But they went back on their word by rejecting the invitation and killing the messengers of the King. As we saw in the Parable of the Landowner, the kingdom was taken away from them and given to a new nation, the community of Jesus' disciples.
 - Galatians 1:6 "I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting Him who called you in the grace of Christ and turning to a different gospel.

Matthew 7:13-14

- "Enter by the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is easy, that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard, that leads to life, and those who find it are few.




Matthew 22:11-13

But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man there who did not have on a wedding garment.

So he said to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless.

"Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'



We are to Put on Immortality

- I Corinthians 15:53-24 "For this perishable nature must put on the imperishable, and this mortal nature must put on immortality. When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory."
- <u>II Corinthians 5:2-4</u> "Here indeed we groan, and long to put on our heavenly dwelling, so that by putting it on we may not be found naked. For while we are still in this tent, we sigh with anxiety; not that we would be unclothed, but that we would be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life.
- Galatians 3:27 "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ? (Expression of Faith)

We are to Put on Righteousness

 Isaiah 61:10 "I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my soul shall be joyful in my God; for He has clothed me with the garments of salvation, He has covered me with the robe of righteousness...."

■ We are to Keep on Righteousness

- Romans 13:14 "But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lusts."
- Ephesians 4:21-24 "Assuming that you have heard about him and were taught in him, as the truth is in Jesus. Put off your old nature which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful lusts, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new nature, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness

Our Responsibility

- We must respond to our invitation
- Though we enter into the Commitment of Faith, are baptized, God wants to see if we are continuing to wear the appropriate wedding garment (Jesus Christ, Faith, Righteousness, etc.).
- There must be evidence of wanting to please God and properly conducting our behavior, as well as speech, in the way of Jesus Christ's example.
- We must express gratitude for our invitation, in continual Faith, Attitude and Conduct, to be Chosen through Jesus Christ gift of Eternal Life (Salvation).
