When a thing is pure, it is unmixed, unalloyed, unadulterated, uncontaminated or undefiled by anything foreign to itself.

- Purity is important to God because God is pure.
- God is free from anything that contaminates, debases, or pollutes.
- A pure life characterizes believers: sin no longer determines the choices we make.



- God's purity has cleansed us from our sins, and we strive to live for Him.
- The believer becomes pure in Christ's justification.
- This purity is not that which appears to be pure on the outside, but that which is truly pure from the inside out.

 - The standards for purity before God shift from merely ceremonial actions to moral conduct.

- Haggai 2:5-23
 - Contrast: Impossibility of holiness being transferred from one to another, but defilement is easily transmitted
 - The sanctity of something or someone dedicated to God cannot be transferred merely by contact with another.



Allow God's Cleansing Agents To Work...

- John 16:13: "However, when it, the Spirit of truth, has come, it will guide you into all truth; for it will not speak on its own authority, but what ever it hears it will speak; and it will tell you things to come."

 - Obedience to the truth through the Spirit purifies our character by inculcating right habits within it.

 To "see" God is to be brought close to Him.


Matthew 5:8
