 - A system or method of measuring or reckoning the passage of time



■ Exodus 12:1-3

- "This month (Abib / Nisan) shall be the beginning of months for you; it is to be the first month (March / April) of the year to you. Speak to all the congregation of Israel, saying, 'On the tenth of this month they are each one to take a lamb for themselves, according to their fathers' households, a lamb for each household."



■ Luke 1:5

 Zacharias, a priest, performed his duties during the course of Abijah.

Luke 1:23-24

 After Zacharias returned home from Jerusalem, Elizabeth conceived.

■ Luke 1:26-28, 36

- In the 6th month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, Mary conceived.
- John was born approximately 6 months before Jesus.

■ I Chronicles 24:1, 7-19, 10

- The sons of Aaron were divided into work groups
- Verses 7-19 lists the 24 priests courses of work, in the temple.
- Verse 10 The course of Abijah was the 8th course.
- The courses began in spring (Nisan), with the course of Jehoiarib.
- After the 24th course was completed the priests would repeat and serve twice a year. (all priests served in the temple during the 3 major festivals (Passover, Pentecost and Tabernacles).

Luke 1:24-38

- Zacharias worked the 8th course (9 10 weeks from the 1st course; early June.
- Therefore, John was conceived shortly after Pentecost and born around the next year's Passover. Jesus would have been born 6 months later, in the Fall Holy Day Season (Feast of Trumpets or Feast of Tabernacles).

■ Luke 2:1-4

 Such censuses were not taken in winter, when temperatures often dropped below freezing and roads were in poor condition. Taking a census under such conditions would have been selfdefeating.



■ Luke 2:7-8

 Shepherds were in the fields watching their flocks at the time of Jesus' birth, "And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn. And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their

flock by night."

■ Luke 2:7-8

 Shepherds were not in the fields during December. December is cold and rainy in Judea, it is likely the shepherds would have sought shelter for their flocks at night






Matthew 12:38-40




Why is Time Management Important?


