- God's Spirit Will Not "Strive"
 - Genesis 6:1-3, 5-8, 12-13
 - Ephesians 4:17-24, 30



- Definition Strive Genesis 6
 - Hebrew *diyn*
 - "to judge, contend, plead"
 - "to plead a cause"
 - "to contend, strive"



- Ephesians 4:30
 - Greek *lypeo*
 - "to make sorrowful"
 - "to affect with sadness, cause grief, to throw into sorrow"
 - "to offend"
 - "to make uneasy"



- Definition Grieve
 - "to cause to suffer"
 - "to feel or show grief over"
 - "to submit a formal grievance concerning"



- As Christians, What is our Duty?
 - Matthew 28:19-20
 - John 6:44
 - Romans 9:15-33



- God, the Father, has made it possible for us to draw close to Him through Jesus Christ.
- A person is lead to the church and is added to the church upon repentance, baptism, giving themselves wholly to the God Family and receiving the Holy Spirit.

- Christians need God's Holy Spirit to maintain integrity to God and receive the gift of eternal life, through the faith of Jesus Christ's sacrifice, with was the ransom sacrifice.

- How Can A Christian Grieve God's Holy Spirit?
 - Galatians 5:16, 25-26
 - Ephesians 4:25-32

- Christians can avoid grieving God's Holy Spirit by walking and living by (direction) of the Spirit.
- We can grieve God's Holy Spirit to a degree by allowing ourselves to drift slowly toward conduct condemned by God's Word.

- How To Avoid Grieving God's Holy Spirit?
 - Be Truthful
 - Angry without Sin
 - Do Not Give Satan an Opportunity
 - Do Not Steal
 - Do Not Use Unwholesome Words
 - Rid Ourselves of Bitterness and Malice
 - Be Kind
