Message From Joel

- Warning to Judah/Jerusalem/Church
 - Similar to the Fall Holy Days of God
- Joel 1:13-15; 2:1-2, 12-16
 - The prophet Joel's warning preceded the physical Babylonian invasion/captivity of Jerusalem, which was a precursor of the times and conditions of the Second Coming of Jesus Christ.
 - The warning of Joel is a warning to the Church, "Get ready! Prepare yourselves!" for the testing and trial to come on all mankind.

Context of the Parables: Second Coming

- Matthew 24:23-31 / The Glorious Return
 - After the 5th Seal (Great Tribulation), the 6th Seal (Heavenly Signs) and the 7th Seal The Day of Lord (God's Wrath), Matthew indicates that Jesus Christ will return, in the clouds of the sky. I Thessalonians 4:13-18 indicates the Saints will be resurrected and/or changed and be part of this return

Context of the Parables: Second Coming

- Fall Holy Days of God and Insight
 - Feast of Trumpets Jesus Christ's return to earth in power, with the resurrected / changed saints
 - Revelation 19:11-19
 - I Thessalonians 4:13-18
 - I Corinthians 15:20-23



Parable of the Fig Tree

Matthew 24:32-36


- The parable shows us we should be aware of prophecy, we should keep an eye on what is happening in the world, but it does require – and we should not allow it to become – our primary focus.
- For the physical, we are to be aware, but not over-attentive. For the spiritual, Christ raises the level of vigilance.
- "Take heed to yourselves"
- Be on guard; Your Heart!



Parable of the Faithful and Unfaithful Servants

■ Matthew 24:42-51

- The parable admonishes us to be faithful and wise in carrying out responsibilities and relationships with our fellow servants, within the church.
- The parable warns us to lead our lives in a way that unites and inspires others to be faithful.
- Links belief with behavior!
- Faithful, Wise and Ready!



Parable of the Ten Virgins

■ Matthew 25:1-13

- The parable pictures the church waiting for the Bridegroom's (Jesus Christ) return. Due to an unexpectedly long delay, He finds half the virgins unprepared, when He arrives.
- Preparedness is an internal state that cannot be transferred to another individual.
- Preparing for eventualities is a lesson of this parable.

Parable of the Talents

Matthew 25:14-30

- The parable illustrates that Jesus Christ expects not only faithfulness in duty and preparedness, but He also expects improvement upon what He has given to us.
- The parable insists that our watchfulness not be passive, but must be accompanied by doing God's given duties and the evidence of growth from His investment.
- Our growth is a progression!

Concerning the Times and Seasons...

■ I Thessalonians 5:1-9

- Admonition to be awake, to be sober and to watch. We should take heed to ourselves (Hebrews 10:26-31).
- We are instructed to watch ourselves, so we can fulfil our part of the covenant!
- Simply watching down the road for a sign of the Master's return really does not prepare us for anything at all.
