"The ancient Egyptians worshipped over 1,400 different gods and goddesses in their shines, temples and homes. These deities were the center of a religion lasting over 3,000 years.
"Many of the Egyptian gods and goddesses were anthropomorphic, which means that they were usually depicted as part human and part animal. . Each deity was responsible for a certain part of daily life or the world around the Egyptians. . . Keeping all of these gods and goddesses happy was hard work and required daily rituals to be performed in temples across Egypt. Food, water, incense and precious materials would be offered to the deities in their temples everyday by groups of priests acting on behalf of the Pharaoh.
"Sometimes, even the Pharaoh would be worshipped as a god."
