■ Galatians 6:1-5

- "...Bear one another's burdens, and thereby fulfill the law of Christ. For if anyone thinks that he is something when he is nothing, he deceives himself. ..."

When we look at the larger passage, Galatians 6:1-5, we see that we are encouraged to restore those caught in sin, bear one another's burdens, and test our own work—bearing the individual load of our own responsibilities.

- Galatians 6:2 says, "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."
 - The word burden here means "a weight of personal and eternal significance."
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 - It can refer to a character flaw, a struggle, or a moral requirement.
 - The Greek word phortion is translated as "load" in this verse and it is defined as a non-transferable personal burden.
 - **❖** As individuals, each of us has non-transferable responsibilities that we are required to fulfill.


Acts 11:27-30
